



First: Try these popular tool searches. Second: Query the full tools database.

There are several types of tools that are most searched for. Search for tools that ...

- [Filter sexually explicit graphic descriptions or images](#): aware, no filter is perfect.
- [Monitor your child's online activities](#): These tools all use different methods.
- [Limits the amount of time your child spends online](#): Set out times of the day when the child can or cannot go online.
- [Block the child's personal information from being posted](#): name, home address, etc.) while they are online.
- [Browsers for kids](#): These are Web browsers that serve to filter out otherwise inappropriate words or images. They are often used on school computers.
